RCSLMK's medical camp with RCC Nabankur Sangha, Chakdah, Nadia saw more than 150 patients ranging from Gynae to orthopedics. Lt Gen Dr SP Datta, past president, Dr Sen, PP Dr Chitra Ray, PE Dr Sudha Chowdhary, Dr Ushasi and I examined patients and gave them advises besides medicines.

Each patient was screened for Diabetes and hypertension by dedicated team of ILS hospital Rotaractors. Local volunteers from RCC Nabankur Sangha guided the patients.



Cases of Prolepses, Goitres, Epilepsy, Severe diabetes and arthritis were seen. Total Rs 40000.00 worth of medicines was distributed besides Rs.40000.00 spent in blanket distribution.

The camp was blessed by local politicians who also helped distribution of club sponsored 200 blankets.



The team comprising doctors, club members, 6 para-medic staff from ILS Hospital and members of proposed Rotaract Club of Salt Lake Metropolitan wrapped up at about at 4.30 pm after having sumptuous lunch and visual treat of mustard fields.

VII 20 Cycle Vans handed over at RCC Dearah ASHA, Meena Khan, District 24 Parganas (S), West Bengal



The 6th phase of RCSLMK and Rotary Gold Coast Lake Success, USA initiated distribution of Cycle Vans and rickshaws under Global Grant 1524507 held at Meena Khan involving RCC Dearah ASHA (Association for Social & Humanitarian Action) was on Sunday, Feb 3, 2019. 20 Cycle Vans were handed over to the beneficiaries, who were earlier short-listed and trained on January 24, 2019 by Social Engineering and Advanced Technical Education.

Many of RCC members being occupied elsewhere in connection with community service including training, the RCC was represented by its Secretary Sanjiv Singh and few of his assistants.

RCC Dearah ASHA identified three hundred kids studying at ten different secondary schools at 7th or higher standards, who cannot afford to buy Geometry Boxes for furthering their studies. RCSLMK, on the same day, came with 100 Geometry boxes for meeting needs of some of the kids.

There were about thirty kids, mostly girls with uniform, from two local schools, who received the boxes from club members. RCC shall hand over the rest of boxes to some of the kids, who are studying in distant schools. Smiles on the innocent faces of the kids on receiving the Geometry Boxes made the day memorable.



Along with distribution of 20 cycle vans, club handed over two handpulled tri-cycles to two persons with weak / deformed feet / legs to let them earn with minimum effort for moving. Also balance of 100 Geometry boxes were handed over for distribution among school kids

Till close of Sunday, February 3, 2019, 143 Cycle Vans and 31 Cycle Rickshaws have been disbursed for handing over to the beneficiaries under the Global Grant project Swabalamban 3.

Cyclist takes on Land's End to John O'Groats challenge at 81 By Jane Cassidy

A grandmother is cycling the length of Britain in memory of her three children who died within four years of each other.

Mavis Paterson, 81, who lives near Stranraer in Dumfries and Galloway, set out yesterday from Land's End and aims to reach John O'Groats in around three weeks.

The Guinness Book of Records has confirmed the 81-year-old will become the oldest woman to complete the 960-mile route.

She hopes to raise £20,000 for Macmillan Cancer Support, a charity she started to support after her mother and sister died from the illness. Paterson said: "I'm excited and a little bit nervous about getting started, however it's something I really want to do.

"It will be nice to get the world record, but for me I'm doing it to raise money for Macmillan and because cycling and taking on big challenges help me cope with the unimaginable grief of losing my children. It's impossibly hard going from being part of a family of five to being alone, but taking on challenges like this that keep me going, and I'm happy I can do it to raise money for Macmillan."

Paterson's children died within four years of each other while all in their 40s, Sandy died of a heart attack in 2012, Katie after suffering viral pneumonia in 2013 and Bob in an accident in 2016.

She said: "I've taken on big challenges before, but this will be the toughest. I really hope people consider donating to help me meet my £20,000 target."

Paterson, who has trained intensively, and her cycling companion Heather Curley, 55, plan to cycle 50-60 miles a day. They will sleep in a specially-designed campervan provided by Scottish firm Tunnock's which will follow them en route stocked with supplies.

Macmillan staff and volunteers will join them for parts of the ride.

Protecting our oceans

Most of us are aware of the high levels plastic pollution in seas and oceans that are destroying marine flora and fauna. We might even be aware of the large floating island of plastics in the North Pacific Ocean. We also know how ingrained the use of single-use plastics are in our culture. It is a big problem, but how do we address it?

The International Yachting Fellowship of Rotarians is the oldest and largest of the Rotary Fellowships. It began in England in 1947 and has grown to 126 fleets with nearly 3,685 members. We have fleets in more than 40 countries. We are a group of Rotarians dedicated to

promoting all aspects of boating as an opportunity for fellowship and service. Our fellowship is also dedicated to protecting our oceans, and promoting the culture of "Reuse, Reduce, Recycle plastics".

Our fleets are working on developing a program against plastic pollution. We have asked for support from incoming District Governors, and many of them have declared this of district interest.

We also promoted the program to Rotaract and Interact clubs because we believe that the entire Rotary family should be involved. It has drawn lots of interest and participation. The Rotaract club presidents have expressed interest in collaborating because they are aware of the great damage that pollution is doing to the planet. They are presenting the project at their clubs and with their groups of friends.

We are developing a website for this special program and young leaders are taking care of the promotion and helping spread it in their communities, universities, clubs and associations. From these groups, we are identifying young leaders who will help us sustain and strengthen the program.

The oceans produce 50% of the oxygen we breathe and absorb 30% of the carbon dioxide we produce. The program will contribute to the plastic decontamination of the oceans and sea. We will organize beach cleanings, plastic waste collections, meetings to raise awareness of the use of plastics, build strategic alliances with partners and sponsors, and protect marine fauna and flora.



No one can solve the problem of plastics pollution alone, but together we will drive global change.
